On February 10th, we received a phone call through the PCC Hotline from a new client named Grace, she is pregnant and was requesting assistance to find employment. After exploring in detail what she needed, we concluded that we would provide her with just about everything she had been asking for. We agreed that she would be going to a local church within her zip code for a church service and following the service, we would introduce her to the church family and bless her with all the items she requested, such as diapers, wipes, baby tub, etc.

In terms of employment, we were shocked and filled with joy when she shared her experience and background with us! If you recall, based on our previous updates on our client Stacey (mother of Jason at Mount Sinai Hospital NICU), she is being faced with the difficult decision to bring Jason home with a g-tube and a tracheotomy. Having no experience in this and no further education on this decision, she was terrified and unsure if she would bring Jason home under these conditions.

Grace came along to the PCC at the perfect time: Grace share that her work experience consists of the following: she is a traveling nurse, with experience working in pediatrics, in the NICU, specifically with babies that have g-tubes and a tracheotomy!! Wow! We praise God that HE has shown up once again in a time of desperation for Stacey's family! Stacey and Grace shared the same zip code, so I invited both Stacey and Grace to ICC church so that they can meet and Grace can help educate her, address her fears and concerns and support her in the decision making for baby Jason.

On Wednesday evening, Grace attended the ICC prayer service. She said "Thank you for this, I really needed to be here in the church." Following service, as promised, we blessed her and showered her with beautiful items she needed for her baby girl expected to arrive in May!

On Thursday, ICC church graciously opened up their boardroom and gave us a private meeting space. Stacey and Grace came to ICC and met for the first time. In a nearly two-hour meeting, we prayed together, Grace answered tons of questions and addressed every concern Stacey had. Grace shared videos of previous babies she had worked with and articles on other children with similar situations to put Stacy at ease.



At the end of the meeting, they exchanged phone numbers and Grace had a list of questions that she encouraged Stacey to ask at her next family meeting with the doctors. Stacey left feeling confident and very optimistic, having faith in the next steps of her journey with Jason! Stacey arrived feeling defeated and discouraged by the reports of the doctors but when she left our meeting, I asked her if she'd like to come join us for the



Sunday service and she responded "When I come back here, I'm coming back with my baby!" How amazing was that response? That's the faith that can move mountains!

Once Stacey reached the hospital and Jason the following morning, she sent me and Grace a group text with an update: "Hi, good morning. I have great news. I'm just afraid about being so confident. Jason is at 21% and we schedule the doctors meeting for next week."

We praise the Lord that baby Jason is in stable condition and is making progress! Please continue to join us in prayer for this family. God is surely up to something!
