She has special needs, is a beautiful young lady with autism and oppositional defiant disorder. Her mother is a believer and has prayed for many years since the birth of Miss K, for the Lord to help her raise her daughter. Her mother reached out to us in desperation hoping we could provide support for her daughter, who is about 31 weeks pregnant. Mom says that during her last doctor visit, the doctor had a private conversation with her daughter without her knowledge and informed Miss K that she can get rid of the baby at any time.

Saddened by this advice, the mom called us hoping we can bring light into her situation. Once I heard this story, I prayed with the mom over the phone and offered to meet with her at a church service. On Easter Sunday, Miss K told her mom she would agree to meet me in person. Shocked that she would agree to this, her mom called me early in the morning and asked to join me at church service at ICC. Arlene offered for the PCC to cover the cost of car service round trip so that they would make it there. Miss K had a fear of traveling on a bus because she had been publicly and physically attacked in the past. We covered the car fare and both mom and daughter showed up for service.



Although Miss K would not speak, she watched and listened to the word of God. Her mom was so happy and felt so blessed to have her daughter sit in on the entire service without opposition. Following the service, I had a van filled with beautiful gifts for her baby boy who would arrive soon! Stroller, car seat, diaper bags, clothing, play pen, and many more items. Miss K, for the first time that day, finally had a smile on her face when she saw all that we had brought for her special baby boy. I asked her if we can take a photo together and she smiled and agreed. She didn't stand too close to me but her willingness to take the photo had consumed her mom with happiness. Since that day, we have remained in communication as we agreed this would not be our last interaction together. We look forward to a long-term partnership with this family as we continue to pray and ask God to uncover resources to help vulnerable young ladies like Miss K.

Volunteer Spotlight

Dr. Joyceann Fileccia, PhD, RN, LCPC, LCCC Volunteer Pregnancy Education, Staff Trainer and Counselor

Most of you know me as the first Director of the CPCNY, INC, now known as the PCCNY. After two years on the Board of Directors, I was entrusted to lead the pregnancy center in all aspects of operation beginning in 1986. Prior to this, little did I



realize that MY name was inscribed in the palms of the hands of my Lord and Savior (Isaiah 49:16). He had been preparing me all along for such a time as this — to help women facing a crisis pregnancy to choose life rather than death for their unborn child.

My pathway to ministry at the PCCNY began as a new nurse, assigned to work at a local hospital in Labor & Delivery. As a federally funded hospital, this medical facility was mandated to perform abortions using two popular procedures at the time: D+C (dilation and curettage) for first trimester pregnancy termination, and Saline Induction for women past the first trimester and up to the 24th week of gestation.

The patients scheduled for pregnancy terminations were admitted to the L&D unit where I saw firsthand as a 21-year-old new nurse, the pain and suffering these women who chose to end their pregnancy by abortion endured. As I worked with these women, I realized how my heart was attuned to the value of life, both for the woman and for her unborn child.

Little did I know, the Lord had me on the potter's wheel — He was about to mold me and shape me into a new creature in Christ. He was about to change my life forever!

In 1982, 8 years after the birth of my first child, a son, I found myself pregnant with my second child — an unplanned crisis pregnancy. The timing of this pregnancy was not advantageous and I was pressure into considering abortion as the only viable option.

Little did I know that the Lord was actively pursuing me. He alone knew what it would take to get my attention to not only say "yes" to Him but to also say "yes" to life.

It was then I remembered a beating heart, eyes, ears, fingers, toes — a tiny living pre-born human being intricately fashioned by God and fitting in the palm of one hand — THIS, accompanied by maternal tears,



sadness and remorseful faces after pregnancy loss made me realize that two lives were forever changed by abortion.

Today, I not only have a wonderful son, but also a beautiful daughter where a crisis pregnancy could have led to a much different outcome. Jesus Christ literally became my Savior, and because He actively pursued me, calling me unto Himself, I by His grace was able to choose life over death; blessings over a curse (Deuteronomy 30:19). I now strive to help other women choose this Godly direction and decision.

As a result of God's miraculous hand in my life, I feel called to pursue a ministry in saving the lives of women experiencing a crisis pregnancy and their unborn precious babies — the Lord's heritage.

Today I proudly serve in the PCCNY as a volunteer pregnancy educator, staff trainer and counselor. In His service, I realize as I look back, that God has had a special plan of prosperity for my life. As I look to the future, and in His name, I seek to serve others in this ministry.

A favorite scriptural reference that has relevance to my service in ministry at the PCCNY comes from Isaiah 6:8, where the prophet Isaiah's response of "Here I am, Lord" clearly revealed his understanding that God had called him for a special life purpose. And so, it is with me. I am blessed to have been called to serve at the PCCNY and like Isaiah, I answer this call to serve with "Here I am, Lord, send me."

I am so grateful for our Pregnancy Care Center of New York precisely because of the work they are doing to help our neighbors flourish. *Flourish* ... This is not a word we use often, so let's understand how the Bible employs it. Flourish occurs mostly in the Old Testament and is translated from the Hebrew word "parach" which means "to bud, sprout, or blossom." The closest New Testament word is the Greek "plethuno" which translates "to multiply, increase, flourish." It is apparent that God's desire for human beings is that we live a life of human flourishing that is rooted in a personal relationship with His Son. Consider the words of Jesus, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly." John 10:10.

Did you notice that Jesus references a serious barrier to human flourishing? Anytime the Lord gives a gift to people, the enemy will produce a perversion of that gift; for example,

God gives us food to nourish our physical bodies, yet the enemy has perverted this gift of food in tempting us to gluttony. Do you see? The same is true for so many other good gifts from God, including this gift of human flourishing. The enemy is working double-time to convince the world that flourishing requires material wealth, physical health, and no difficulty whatsoever. Sadly, I believe this perversion of God's intention for flourishing is at the root of many decisions to terminate pregnancies. How tragic! Because, it is simply not true that human flourishing wholly depends upon the unhindered pursuit of material wealth, physical health, and the absence of difficulty in our lives.



Consider that Jesus did not live a life marked by abundant material wealth, or perfect physical health, and He certainly faced significant difficulty in His life on earth. Yet there is no human who has ever flourished like our Lord and Savior. A flourishing life is the Christ-Life! Thomas a Kempis once wrote, "We must imitate Christ's life and His ways if we are to be truly enlightened and set free from the darkness of our own hearts. Let it be the most important thing we do, then, to reflect on the life of Jesus Christ."

If we want to truly experience human flourishing, it will be in imitating Christ Jesus. If we want others to flourish, let us say with the Apostle Paul, "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ." 1 Corinthians 11:1. I am praying, and I encourage you to pray, for our friends at the Pregnancy Care Center of New York as they flourish and help others experience flourishing as well.
